

OUR CLASSROOMS

There will be 6 beautifully designed classrooms with natural materials, soft colors, wooden toys and cozy learning spaces. Although the building will be licensed as a Childcare Center, our goal is to create each classroom to feel like an intimate homelike center which fosters a sense of community. Each classroom will have unique materials that represent different cultures, a plethora of quality books, and open ended toys and activities that promote wonder and exploration.



Children will start in the class they will be in for the 2022–2023 school year and stay with the same cohort of children until they leave for kindergarten. Each September the class will move up to the next room. Teachers will have the option to move up with the class or stay in their designated age-group. Each class will start with 2 teachers and a shared assistant teacher. As enrollment grows, we will add a 3rd teacher to each class.





The Buildout

The building was previously an adult daycare, and thus the general layout was exactly what we were looking for. We are renovating the building to bring it up to code for the City of Bellevue and licensing. This includes expanding a few classrooms, adding sinks and bathrooms to each classroom, replacing the floors and painting. We are currently in the permit process and have chosen a general contractor. Renovations are currently slated to begin end of January and are expected to take about 4 months. Once the building is complete, we will set up and begin the licensing process, which typically takes up to 90 days. While we wait for our license, children above 2.5 may start with half days.




We will be prioritizing families needing full time care and reserving at least 60% of spaces for Full Time. 30% of spaces will go to partial day, half day, M/W/F and T/Th schedules. The remaining 10% of spaces will be divided for alternate schedules such as mix-matched days or 1 day/week schedules.


ABOUT OUR SPACES

Outdoor Classrooms

There are 3 smaller side yards that will each be dedicated to an age group. Our 2 infant classes will share an outdoor class with padded floors, low obstacles to crawl over, and areas for sensory play. The 1 and 2 year olds will have access to an outdoor classroom with cars and trucks to push around and a sand & water table. The 3-5 year olds (Preschool and Pre-K) have a garden space to tend to, as well as a space for books and easel painting.

The outdoor classes are intended for small groups, as well as the whole class. They will also be used during quiet time when some children are no longer napping or have woken up.





Natural Playground

We believe there is no such thing as bad weather, just bad clothing! We go outside rain or shine, for a minimum of 2 hours a day. Children wear rain suits and are encouraged to jump in puddles, look for insects, and make mud soup!


Our large outdoor playground on the south side of the property will be fully fenced and spread with play chips. A neighborhood of wooden playhouses will be connected with stepping stones. A climbing dome will be in the center to build gross motor skills, along with obstacle courses made from stumps, tires and beams.

Open ended, imaginative play will be encouraged with loose parts such as tires, stumps, buckets, gutters, and 2x4's. Greenery and garden beds will be tended to with the help of the children. We will have 2 picnic tables undercover for art, provocations, picnics, and reading books.


Atrium/Shared Studio/Cozy Area

There is a Foyer in the school which will be shared by all classrooms as needed. This space will be the shared art studio, with a table for small groups and a plethora of supplies and materials ranging from paint to seashells.



CAREGIVERS WILL SPEND THE DAY SNUGGLING WITH, READING TO, AND ENGAGING OUR YOUNGEST LITTLE HUMANS.

EACH INFANT ROOM WILL HAVE A CHANGING STATION WITH A SINK, REFRIGERATOR FOR MILK AND FOOD, 8 CRIBS, A ROCKING CHAIR, MATS AND ACTIVITY GYMS FOR TUMMY TIME, STRUCTURES FOR CLIMBING ON AND PULLING THEMSELVES UP WITH, SILICONE TEETHING TOYS, WOODEN TOYS, BOARD BOOKS, BLOCKS, AND LOTS OF LARGER LOOSE PARTS. TEACHERS WILL FOLLOW EACH INFANT'S INDIVIDUAL SCHEDULE FOR SLEEPING, FEEDING AND PLAY TIME. THIS WILL BE RECORDED ON THE PROCARE CONNECT APP. FAMILIES WILL BRING MILK AND FOOD FROM HOME WHILE IN THE INFANT CLASSROOM.

THE WORLD OF A ONE YEAR OLD IS FULL OF WONDER! THEY ARE LEARNING TO WALK, LEARNING NEW WORDS, AND BECOMING MORE INDEPENDENT EACH AND EVERY DAY. EVERY EXPERIENCE IS NEW TO THEM, FROM LEAVES FALLING ON A CRISP AUTUMN DAY, TO THE FEEL OF DRIED RICE IN A SENSORY BIN. AT THIS AGE CHILDREN BEGIN TO FORM FRIENDSHIPS AND WE FOCUS ON SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL SKILLS.

OUR ONE YEAR OLD ROOM IS FULL OF RICH SENSORY ACTIVITIES, A CLIMBER TO CLIMB UP AND SLIDE DOWN, COZY SPACES TO CUDDLE UP WITH A TEACHER AND READ BOOKS, A COMMUNITY RUG FOR MUSIC, DANCE AND GROUP ACTIVITIES, AND A TABLE FOR ART AND SCIENCE ACTIVITIES. THE PRIMARY NAP TIME WILL BE IN THE AFTERNOONS, BUT MORNING NAPS WILL BE OFFERED ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASES. MEALS WILL BE OFFERED, BUT FOOD FROM HOME IS ACCEPTED.



TODDLERS ROOM

Class of 14 children
2 lead teachers and 1 assistant teacher/ float (shared with 1's class)
For children who will be 2 years by 8/31/22

At age two, we focus our learning on social-emotional and independence skills. Children are learning to share, play side by side, use their imaginations, and develop more vocabulary. They are learning how to put their shoes and coats on by themselves, how to eat more independently and how to use the bathroom. Our toddler environment will be set up to teach and encourage these skills.





Wooden furniture will all be sized for little ones, tables and chairs are low, a small kitchen and dramatic play area, a climber with a slide, and low shelves for them to access open-ended wooden toys and puzzles. A cozy classroom library will always be available to expand their vocabulary and encourage dialogue between the children and teachers. A community circle rug will be in the center of the class for daily group activities, singing and dancing. Toddlers are given choices between 2 different activities most of the day to encourage autonomy of their learning. They are taking in the world around them, exploring, pushing boundaries, and asking a million questions! Our teachers help guide this curiosity through open-ended play-based activities and provocations. Quiet time will be between 1-3pm, but alternate activities will be provided when they awake. Meals will be offered, but food from home is accepted.

PRESCHOOL ROOM



The preschool years are all about exploring the world around them. Preschoolers are curious, independent, confident, and eager to learn. They are able to communicate easier with other children and adults; resulting in friendships forming and motor skills developing.

Our preschool classroom will be full of different areas for focused learning experiences. A dramatic play corner is full of diverse real life materials such as clothes from different cultures, play foods from around the world, baby dolls in all skin tones, and unique household items such as silver spoons and old telephones. A nature and STEM table set up with items from nature, magnifying glasses, measuring tools, and books to inspire curiosity and research answers. A sensory table will be ever-changing with small motor tools to investigate different textures and senses. The preschool classroom will have a writing and an open-end process art table with a shelf of materials to inspire and create with. Developmentally appropriate toys, puzzles and games will fill the shelves and be rotated as the season change. Numbers, letters, colors, and shapes will be integrated into every day activities and provocations. We do not believe in requiring worksheets or flashcards for this age, instead they are invited and encouraged to explore the teachers well thought out provocations. Quiet time will be between 1-3pm, but alternate activities will be provided when they awake. Meals will be offered, but food from home are accepted. Children do NOT need to be potty trained to join our Preschool class.





Pre-Kindergarten Classroom


NATURE BASED

Our new space will have natural colors, soft lighting, wooden furniture and materials, natural loose parts, and be filled with classrooms with indoor plants.



NORDIC INFLUENCE



COMPASSION AND EMPATHY

ine Nordic model revolves around childhood, children's well-being, play and learning through participation and discovery. There is a large focus on curiosity, creativity, and the idea that children are the world's most valuable resource. Nordic parents and educators are strong believers in unstructured outdoor play to teach children to better understand their place in relation to the natural world, to appreciate the need for preserving the environment, and to strive to be more sustainable. We have adopted the Swedish word friluftsliv, which means being close to nature and the Danish word Hygge which means a feeling of coziness and contentment.

every child is born with a sense of compassion and empathy. It is a complex skill that will continue to develop through their life. Teachers compassion, validate a child's emotions, role play, and work through difficult conflicts with the child to teach them the skills they need to problem solve. Saying "sorry" does not help them learn empathy. A more meaningful approach is to focus on the other person's feelings. We believe children deserve to be treated with respect and taught to treat people of all races, abilities, and backgrounds with kindness and dece



PROCESS OVER PRODUCT-WE GET MESSY!

Process-based learning is a holistic approach. Aspects of learning are thought of in a more broad sense, rather than teaching to specific targeted objectives. For the teacher, the process of the learning becomes the objective where learner decides where the process will go, the pace and direction of the learning, and therefore the pace and the direction of the teaching. The teacher may prompt and try different strategies to elicit progress but will ultimately be guided to the learning outcome by the student (Imray and Hinchcliffe; 2014).



OUR COVID POLICY

At Growing Tree, we have been taking our Covid precautions very seriously and following all King County, CDC and DOH recommendations to minimize risk of spreading sickness

All Teachers are Vaccinated & Wear Masks

Teachers and specialists are all fully vaccinated and wear masks. Adults wear masks at pick up and drop off.

Illness Policy

Children will be closely monitored for symptoms upon entrance and throughout the day. If any symptoms are present throughout the household, children must stay home until symptom free for at least 24 hours. Illness policy currently includes all household members.

Daily Temperature Checks

Parents must take child's temperature before coming to school and medicine may not be given to reduce fever before school. Temperatures will be checked by teachers throughout the day and teachers may send children home if they feel they are too sick to be at school

Play it Safe!

Please play it safe! Do not rush back to school if there is any hesitation. It puts the child, other children, other families, and teachers at risk.

Mask Policy

Masks are required for teachers throughout the day and parents during drop off/pick up. Children over 5 are required to wear a mask. Mask wearing is strongly encouraged for children ages 2–5. Children under 2 will not wear any face coverings.

Increased Hand Washing & Additional Cleaning Procedures

We practice additional hand washing for both teachers and children, including but not limited to: arrivals, transitions, before and after meals, after high-contact activities, and with potty or diapering activities. Toys and surfaces are cleaned, disinfected, and laundered regularly.

Safe Return to School

Doctor's note and/or proof of a negative Covid-19 test are required upon return for children with any symptoms. Children must be symptom free of any non-COVID illness for at least 24hrs (48hrs is preferable) before returning.

Depending on the CDC recommendations, travel restrictions may be in place .



We met as toddlers at a home-based daycare on Mercer Island. As children we were always found with baby dolls in our arms or even assisting with the younger infants at our daycare. In middle school our entrepreneural spirit engaged and we started a neighborhood babysitting business. 2013: opened The Growing Tree Playcare & Preschool, a licensed home daycare in Bellevue, WA.

2016: opened The Treehouse Playcare & Preschool for children 2.5-4 years old.

2019: added a Pre-Kindergarten Annex to Treehouse Playcare & Preschool for children 4 and 5 years old.

2022: Opening The Growing Tree center!

We started with just the two of us doing all the teaching and have grown to a current team of 15 wonderful teachers. Our program and curriculum continues to grow and adapt. We take great pride in continuing education and stay up to date with the latest research in early childhood eduction.

Our mission is simple. We want to provide a unique, enriching, and loving environment for children to thrive in. All of our locations are play and nature-based to help us accomplish this.
